#### Introduction

As we move through the final term of the school year, we are looking forward to scheduling more events that include parents and carers. These will be carefully planned to ensure everyone's safety. I have outlined events planned to date below. You will be informed of additional events as they arise. You will find additional information on Seesaw, the school's website and Twitter account.

#### **Attendance**

Before the pandemic we had managed to raise our school attendance to around our target of **96%.** It was inevitable that this figure would drop during the subsequent lockdown and isolation restrictions. Most schools have seen their attendance figures gradually rise and return to almost pre-pandemic figures. Unfortunately, our attendance figure currently stands at only, which is a real cause for concern. I know the education welfare officer and Mrs Utzeri sent out the traffic light attendance letters just before Easter. If your child's rating was red or amber, please do everything in your power to improve your child's attendance. The children have missed so much direct teaching due to the impact of covid-19 and every missed day of learning will set your child's progress back further.

#### Attendance facts

- If your child's attendance is 95% they have lost 9 days teaching
- If your child's attendance is 90% they have lost 19 days teaching
- If your child's attendance is **85%** they have missed **150 lessons!**
- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3.5 days lost each year (missing 20 lessons)
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year (missing 55 lessons).

School starts at 8.55am. The gates open at 8.50am for parents to 'drop and go.' The gates will be locked again at 9am. Please ensure your child is in school by 8.55am as a rising number of children are arriving late after 9am.

#### Staffing

I am delighted to inform you that Miss Jones has given birth to a beautiful baby boy, Zach Louis. I know Miss Jones will be bringing him into to school very soon. I would like to welcome back Mrs Blower following her maternity leave. It is wonderful to have her back with us, teaching Year 3.

We say goodbye to two of our support staff this half term. Our school business manager, Mrs Knight, is leaving to take up a position nearer to home. Mrs Rose and her family are moving back to Nottingham. We will miss them both and I would like to take this opportunity to express my thanks for all their hard work and to wish them all the best for the future. We have appointed Mrs J Higgins as clerical assistant and governors have started the recruitment process for the new school business manager. Until the new person is appointed, Mrs Shepley has kindly agreed to return to work in school for two days a week to help us out.

Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school at all times as there will be many outdoor sporting activities taking place this term.

#### **End of Year Assessments**

All Y6 children will be undertaking end of key stage assessments during the week beginning 9<sup>th</sup> May. Year 2 pupils will be assessed using a variety of teacher assessments during May, and the final levels will be reported to parents as part of the annual report.

It is imperative that no Y6 pupils are absent during these weeks and all absences should be kept to a minimum. The Y6 timetable is below. Please note there is no flexibility in this, all children in England take the tests at the same time.
