# AUTUMN 2022 HEADTEACHER'S NEWSLETTER

#### Introduction

It has been a lovely start to the autumn term this week. The children are all happy to be back and enthusiastic about their new classes. They have quickly settled back in to school routines and are already working hard. For parents/carers new to St Andrew's, I would like to take this opportunity of welcoming you and your children to our school family. I am sure your child will be very happy here.

## Communication

I am happy to inform you that we intend to plan more opportunities to welcome parents/carers into school now it is safe to do so. We are reintroducing class led worship, which families are welcome to attend, and parents' evening will be held face to face in school in November.

We try to keep parents/carers as informed and involved as possible and are continually updating our school website **www.standrewsmethodistschool.co.uk** and Twitter account. This can be found at **Twitter@StMethodist**. Your child's class will add any exciting learning to these sites, so you can log on to see what they have been up to- you may be surprised!

#### Seesaw

The Seesaw app has become an invaluable tool for communication between home and school. We will be continuing to use See saw to set children's homework and share information with you. Please remember that if you have an issue you would like to discuss with a member of staff, this should not be raised on Seesaw but via a phone call or in person at a pre-arranged appointment.

## Meet the teacher meetings

You will shortly receive a Home/School knowledge planner from your child's teacher, introducing themselves and outlining work to be covered this half-term. I hope you find these to be interesting and useful, when supporting your child with homework. These can also be found on the school website.

## Staffing

We are delighted to welcome Mrs Smith, Mr Lewis and Mrs Davies to our team of teachers- they are already proving to be great assets to our school.

## Place2Be

We are extremely fortunate that we have been successful in applying to be part of a research project involving Place2Be. You may have heard of this charity, which works in schools to improve the emotional wellbeing of children. We have been given a Place2Be worker, Alice, who will work in school every Thursday and Friday. She will work with individual children and small groups who need support with any friendship issues, school pressures and other worries. There is also support for parents/carers. You will be able to access ree advice, resources and services. You can find out more at **place2be.org.uk/family**. Please note that parents/carers will be fully involved in any referrals for targeted support from Alice. More information regarding this project will be sent out over the coming weeks and published on the website.

# Uniform

Our children are looking very smart in their uniforms, which have hopefully all been labelled. Please note that trainers and boots e.g.; Ugg Boots are <u>NOT</u> allowed in school, the correct footwear is black shoes. Children wearing incorrect footwear will be **required to wear PE pumps** in school. The only bags needed in school are reading folders and PE bags.

All children with long hair are required to have it tied up neatly in a bobble. Long, flowing hair is not practical at school, as it gets in the way when children are working, falling into their eyes. It also makes it easier for any outbreaks of head lice to spread. Long hair that is neatly tied and clipped up looks much smarter and is much safer for P.E. Thank you for your co-operation with this. Children with long hair that is left loose, will be given a hair bobble and asked to tie their hair up.

The only jewellery permitted are watches and stud earrings. Children, wearing hoop earrings, or any other jewellery, will be asked to remove them and keep them in their tray until home time. School will not be held responsible for any accidents resulting from wearing inappropriate earrings or other jewellery.



## **Punctuality and Attendance**

It is still vitally important that your child arrives for school at the specified time and attends regularly as they missed so much learning last year. All teaching staff are working very hard to ensure all children progress and achieve their best so excellent attendance is imperative.

I wrote to you in the summer term to outline the school's position on attendance, which will be rigorously adhered to from September. During the pandemic school, attendance was inevitably affected. Our attendance dropped to a worrying level last year. This is exacerbated by the high number of children going on holiday during term time. The law is clear surrounding this issue. Parents have NO entitlement to take their child on holiday in term time. As you are aware, school does NOT authorise any holidays. The local authority(LA) can issue a holiday penalty notice (HPN) to parents who take children on holiday without consent from the school. The LA can give each parent a fine of £60, which rises to £120 each if you do not pay within 21 days. If you do not pay the fine after 28 days, you may be prosecuted for your child's absence from school. I need to inform you that, from September any parent who keeps their child off school to go on holiday WILL receive a fine. From September, attendance of all pupils will be rigorously monitored and any persistent absence addressed by the Education Welfare Officer.

## Medical Appointments

Can you please try, whenever possible, to request medical appointments eg; dentist and doctors, after 3.30pm. This avoids children missing their learning by being taken out of school for appointments.

Should there be any matters of concern regarding your child you should first discuss these (over the telephone) with the class teacher or teaching assistant. They are the people who know your child best and who are aware of incidents that happen during the school day. Should you feel that your concerns have not been resolved, or if there is an urgent matter you need to discuss with me, I am happy to speak with you at a convenient time that can be arranged via the office. Our family support worker, Mrs Utzeri is now available every day and can be contacted via the office.



#### School Meals

All children in Reception Class, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal. I would encourage you to take full advantage of this. For parents/carers choosing to provide a healthy packed lunch, please note that large chocolate bars (e.g. Mars Bar) and sweets are not suitable items. A healthy drink e.g.; water or carton of fresh fruit juice is fine. **No nut products are allowed.** 

If you are entitled to free school meals, due to receiving benefits, then you still need to apply via the gateway. Please ensure you do this, as your child will also receive free school milk. See letter attached. Infant children are provided with a piece of free fruit every day, and all children in school have access to fresh drinking water. Please note that children are **not** allowed any other drinks (eg fruit cordial) in water bottles.
