#### Introduction

### **Remote Learning**

As you will be aware, we use Seesaw to support children's learning at home. Seesaw is used to set and mark homework, communicate with parents/carers and provide remote learning in the event that any children have to isolate at home.

You will continue to receive half termly Home/School knowledge planners from your child's teacher, outlining knowledge to be taught this half-term. I hope you find these to be interesting and useful, when supporting your child with homework. These can also be found on the school website.

#### Uniform

The children are all looking very smart in their uniforms- thank you for supporting us with our uniform policy. As the weather becomes colder please remember that trainers and boots e.g.; Ugg Boots are <u>NOT</u> allowed in school, the correct footwear is black shoes. Children wearing incorrect footwear will be **required to wear PE pumps** in school. The only bags needed in school are reading folders and PE bags.



## **Punctuality and Attendance**

It is vitally important that your child arrives for school at the specified time and **attends regularly**. Staff are working very hard to ensure all children progress and achieve their best and good attendance is key to this. If you child is going to be absent for any reason, please remember to telephone the school office before 9.30am. Any holidays taken in term time WILL receive a fine.

Can you please try, whenever possible, to request medical appointments after 3.30pm. This avoids children missing their learning by being taken out of school for appointments.

Should there be any matters of concern regarding your child you should first discuss these (over the telephone) with the class teacher, teaching assistant or family support worker, Mrs Utzeri.
