SPRING 2023 HEADTEACHER'S NEWSLETTER

Introduction

Happy New Year to all our school family! I hope you enjoyed a lovely Christmas break with your children. In this first newsletter of 2023. I will inform you of some initial dates and activities for the spring term. These will be added to as the term progresses.

Unfortunately, we returned to school after new year to find a burst pipe had caused significant water damage to the KS2 department. This meant that Y5 and 6 were unable to return with the other children. Thank you so much to their parents and carers for their patience and understanding with this situation.

Fundraising

The school Christmas disco made a fantastic profit of £504.85 for school funds. This year we are using school fund in a variety of ways, including subsidising school visits that will take place in the spring and summer terms. This will keep the cost down for families during these challenging times.

Attendance

Our attendance figures continued to be extremely low in the autumn term. At 93%, this is significantly below our target of 96%. Moving forward we will continue to take the following actions;

- Monitor, and take action around, the attendance of any child who falls below target.
- Issue fines to any parents who take pupils on holiday in term time
- Ask for medical evidence for children who are persistently absent
- Require parents/carers to attend meetings with the education welfare officer and school attendance lead where attendance is a concern.

Parent Pay

A quick reminder to ensure that all parent/carers have activated their ParentPay account. Even if your child is on FSM it is still important to have access to ParentPay as we not only use it for payments but it is also one of our main communication methods for texts and emails. This means for example if the school was to close for any reason we would use ParentPay to send a message informing every one of the closure. If you do not have access to these details please do not hesitate to phone the school office or call in.

Road Safety

- Year 6 will be taking part in the Bikeability scheme run by the Road Safety team. This cycling course is free of charge and delivered by nationally accredited instructors. It is so important to ensure the safety of our pupils when riding their bicycles. The course will take place during the week commencing 6th March.
- Year 6 will also be attending the Crucial Crew project. This will be paid for from school funds.

Sports Partnerships and Spring Term Clubs

Sale Sharks will be visiting school for several weeks from 28th February, to deliver the Try2connect project in Y6. This focuses on emotional wellbeing and transition to high school.

Premier Sports and Rees Sports will continue to deliver football, cricket and multi skills coaching at lunchtimes and after school.
