Working with our Partners

Sale Sharks

Sale Sharks will be leading a series of lessons, over a six-week period (commencing 30th October), with Y5 and Y6 as part of their 'Try to Connect' programme. This is a school-based mental wellbeing programme delivered in partnership with Place2Be. It promotes positive mental health for primary aged children and includes classroom workshops followed by a tag rugby and multi-sport session that incorporates the themes discussed in the class based session.

Salford Road Safety Team

The schools' road safety team will be coming into to speak to KS2 classes about keeping children safe on the roads in winter. Evidence suggests that child pedestrian road accidents are more likely to occur in the mornings and afternoons on week-days during the winter months. The 'Be safe, be seen' class sessions have been developed to help children to keep themselves safe.

We have been making lots of plans to ensure that Christmas in school, will be a magical and exciting time for the children. I have outlined the proposed Christmas celebrations and dates below.

Children are allowed to wear a Christmas jumper instead of their school sweatshirt on this day.
