LITERACY

This half term we will be reading 'Pigs Might Fly!' by Jonathan Emmett and Steve Cox and reading some of **Roald Dahl's Revolting Rhymes!**

Pigs Might Fly introduces a seguel to the traditional tale, The Three Little Pigs. It is very comical and I know that the children will love it! They will be comparing the similarites with the first story, creating adverts for the 'Pie in the sky race' and adapting the story to create their own narratives. The children will also be performing poetry, acting and reciting 'Little

Red Riding Hood and The Wolf'.

MATHS

Some of the learning this half term will be to:

- Recap telling the time to the hour, half past, quarter past and guarter to the hour
- Tell the time to the nearest five minutes past the hour
- Tell the time to the nearest five minutes past the hour
- Recap partitioning a two-digit number into a multiple of 10 and another number
- Partition a two-digit number in different ways and reason about how the parts change
- Correctly place a number from 1-100 on a number line with multiples of 10 marked but not labelled

SCIENCE This half term we will continue with plants.

The children will coming back to school to see the results of their experiment. They have planted seeds, each with different variables to see which plant will be the healthiest.

- · One in the dark without water
- One in the dark with water
- One in the light with water
- One in the light without water

The children each made predictions about the outcome of each pot so they will be concluding their findings.
